A Gospel reflection from Fr. Alphonse:



In today's Gospel, Jesus heals the woman of her sickness and raises Jairus' dead daughter to life.

Who is responsible for a miracle? Does it come from the faith of the one who asks, or is it from Christ who works the miracle? If the miracle depends solely on the faith of persons, then what is the difference between the faithful one who asks God for a cure and the one who goes to any faith healer?

In this latter case, it would be enough that one convinces oneself that they are healed, and the one actually doing the healing would not matter much.

Of course, these people coming to Jesus were very far from recognizing Him as the Son of God, but they were convinced that God would give them some blessing through this prophet and holy man. This faith prepared them to receive healing in both body and spirit. How can God heal those who refuse to hope?

However, what stands out in this Gospel is the power of Christ: Jesus was conscious that healing power had gone out from Him. *"Your faith has saved you."* Jesus says, *"it has saved"* you: not *"it has healed"* you. For this woman had risked all and finally had seen how much God loved her.

Our Savior Jesus Christ destroyed death and brought life to light through the Gospel.

CATHOLIC CORNER: *(a gentle reminder of facts we've learned but perhaps have forgotten or not thought about in a long time)*

The Gospels were written by men who were among the first to have the faith and wanted to share it with others. Having known in faith who Jesus is, they could see and make others see the traces of his mystery in all his earthly life. From the swaddling clothes of his birth to the vinegar of his Passion and the shroud of his Resurrection, everything in Jesus' life was a sign of his mystery. His deeds, miracles and words all revealed that "in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily." His humanity appeared as "sacrament", that is, the sign and instrument, of his divinity and of the salvation he brings: what was visible in his earthly life leads to the invisible mystery of his divine sonship and redemptive mission. *Catechism of the Catholic Church 515*

Hear, O Lord, and have pity on me; O Lord, be my helper. You changed my mourning into dancing; O Lord, my God, forever will I give you thanks.
