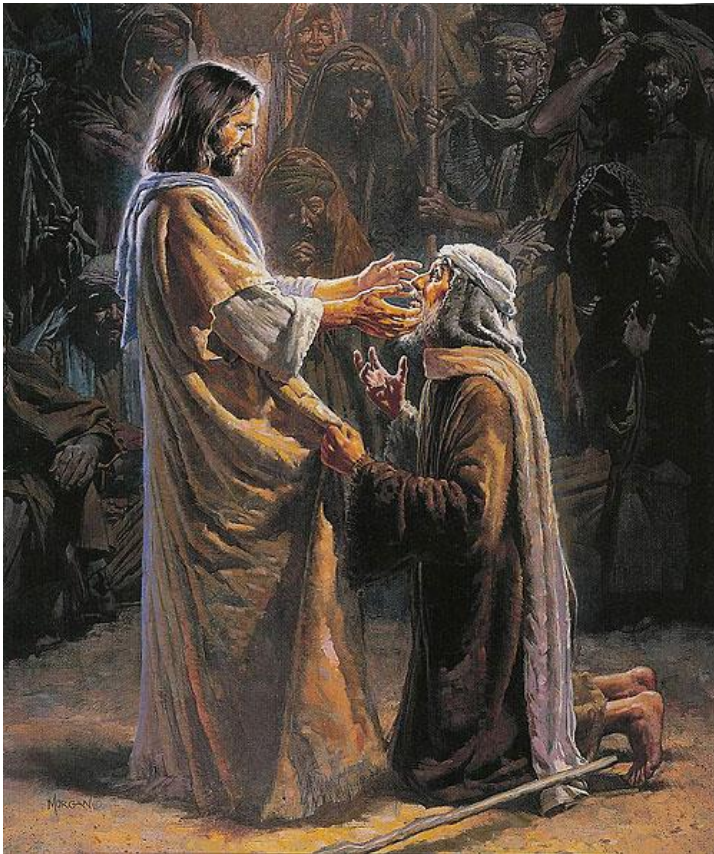

A Gospel reflection from Fr. Alphonse:



*Come to me, all who labor and
are burdened, and I will refresh
you, says the Lord.....*

In today's Gospel we read "Jesus laid His hands on them and healed them." And people were astonished and asked: "What is this wisdom that has been granted to Him and these miracles that are worked through Him?" In another place we read: "He has done wonderful things." We may ask: "Has God hands?"

Hands are instrumental in showing love and concern for others. When we were children our mothers must have taken us in their hands, rescued us from dangers, and done everything they could with their hands to show their affection for us: hands establish relationship between persons; hands direct us, hands save us.

Hands can also express the highest sign of love; they can support, guide, warn, frighten, serve as a sign of friendship. A handshake can encourage, show one's interest in others; it can console; it can reconcile enemies and make friends.

If the hands of man are an expression of love, how much more so will be God's who is love itself. His hands are seen in Jesus of Nazareth who reveals His being, His nature, His love for us. In Him God's hands are seen; hands which cured, consoled, gave new life; hands which gave of Himself in the form of bread and wine, hands which were pierced for us and which were stretched out on the cross, to embrace the whole of humanity.

As Christians we have a tremendous responsibility to continue the salvific work of Jesus Christ. We can open our doors to Him or slam them in His face. Our hands can do the works of God or obstruct them.

CATHOLIC CORNER: (a gentle reminder of facts we've learned but perhaps have forgotten or not thought about in a long time)

Whoever is in the state of grace and, with a right intention, desires to eat of the bread of life, may receive Holy Communion every day. If he has committed venial sins he should be sorry for them beforehand. If he still remains attached to his venial sins, his Communion does not become an unworthy, or "bad" Communion, but he will receive less grace.

If anyone has separated himself from God by mortal sin, he must first be reconciled with God in the sacrament of Penance. If he were deliberately to go to the Table of the Lord, knowing that he was in mortal sin, then he would be communicating unworthily, and would commit a sacrilege by his bad Communion. St. Paul says: "Therefore whoever eats this bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily, will be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord... For he who eats and drinks unworthily, without distinguishing the body, eats and drinks judgment to himself" (1Cor.11:27-29)

The best preparation we can make for Holy Communion is to take our due part attentively in the celebration of Mass. First we unite ourselves with Christ in prayer, and listen in a spirit of faith to the proclamation of the word. Then we humbly prepare ourselves to join in with the Priest in praise and thanks, and to offer ourselves completely to the Father with Christ and we pray for God's mercy. (The Living Faith)

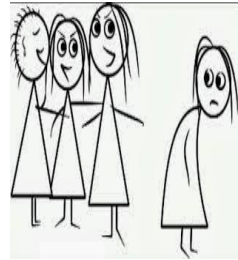
I have no time.....
