

In today's Gospel Jesus begins His ministry by organizing a mission throughout the province. Before, the apostles accompanied Jesus, but now He sends

A Gospel reflection from Fr. Alphonse:

Jesus is an educator. He not only teaches His followers. He has them participate in His mission. His apostles must also proclaim their faith and perform healings as the Master does. By doing this, they concretize what they have discovered of the kingdom of God. The disciples should be the first ones to believe what they themselves proclaim: God makes himself present. Because of this, they must live day by day, trusting in the Father's providence, not frightened but always conscious of God's mission and power.

Oil was used at the time as a remedy, but Jesus gives it a new meaning: more than just well-being, the healings will also be the sign of spiritual healing, the reconciliation of man with God. Jesus' concern for forming communities of believers is already present. He sends His disciples out two by two so that the message will not be from one person only, but an expression of a group united in the one mission. Jesus tells them to stay under one roof with one family so that this may be a center radiating the faith.




Today we worry about our world. We worry about the Church losing ground. We worry about evil winning. Why doesn't someone do something? Why isn't everyone a saint? God help us....
