*A Gospel reflection from Fr. Alphonse:*


In his self-righteousness, Simon who invited Jesus, felt no love for Jesus and received no forgiveness. The woman, condemned as a sinner was overwhelmed with love for Jesus and could receive forgiveness. Here we discover that sin when recognized and repented in love can lead to gratitude and deep love of which the Pharisees and self-righteous were not able. What prevents man from receiving grace is pride and his exaggerated self-sufficiency. The more humble he is, the more he will acknowledge his own sinfulness as St. Francis of Assisi who says, "There is nowhere a more wretched and a more miserable sinner than I".

Simon the Pharisee is a warning to us. We learn that it is not enough to be physically or spiritually close to Jesus; it is not enough to be baptized and be called Christians; it is not enough to do at times charitable work or take some time to pray. Unless we encounter Jesus in love, we may go empty-handed like Simon who in spite of his closeness to Jesus received no blessings. At the same time, the woman, (in the Gospel) the sinner, teaches us that he who is humble, who acknowledges his own frailty and insufficiency, will benefit most from God's grace. One who approaches the Lord with love, and worships him in spirit and truth will be richly rewarded. He will have Jesus' assurance "Your sins are forgiven, go in peace" (Lk 7:48)

*Lord, forgive the wrong I have done. I acknowledged my sin to you, my guilt I covered not. I said, "I confess my faults to the Lord," and you took away the guilt of my sin. (Psalm 32)*

Lord God, in this bread and wine You give us food for body and spirit. May the Eucharist renew our strength and bring us health of mind and body. We ask this in the name of Jesus the Lord. Amen



**CATHOLIC CORNER:** *(a gentle reminder of facts we've learned but perhaps have forgotten or not thought about in a long time)*

**Judge not, that ye be not judged.** Matthew 7.1

Pointing out the *truth* is not being judgmental. Here are a few of what does not constitute being judgmental:

- It is not judgmental to make a moral appraisal of whether a person's actions are sinful or whether the person is likely culpable for them.
- It is not judgmental to have a negative emotional reaction to what is objectively evil.
- It is not judgmental to bear in mind that a person you have forgiven has committed harmful actions in the past and may commit them again in the future.

One way to avoid being judgmental is to avoid making rash judgments.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* states:

To avoid rash judgment, everyone should be careful to interpret insofar as possible his neighbor's thoughts, words, and deeds in a favorable way: "Every good Christian ought to be more ready to give a favorable interpretation to another's statement than to condemn it. But if he cannot do so, let him ask how the other understands it. And if the latter understands it badly, let the former correct him with love. If that does not suffice, let the Christian try all suitable ways to bring the other to a correct interpretation so that he may be saved"

Remember that the next time your little hut seems to be burning to the ground. It just may be a smoke signal that summons the Grace of God.
